Reach for Excellence empowers determined learners and expands their possibilities in the classroom, in the community, and in life.

Reach for Excellence is a tuition-free academic and leadership enrichment program for Metro Atlanta middle school students who possess limited opportunities and resources. Any fifth-grade student of limited income (defined as \$50,000 or less) in the Metro Atlanta area, who is academically talented and interested in making the three-year commitment, can apply to the program.

Reach for Excellence prepares talented middle school students to succeed in college preparatory programs. Through three six-week summer sessions and three years of Saturday courses, the program provides and reinforces the academic and social skills each student needs to succeed in high school, college, and beyond. The average class size is 12 students allowing for more one on one instruction. Certified master teachers from public and private schools create a unique environment where students learn about academic subjects, their community, each other, and themselves.



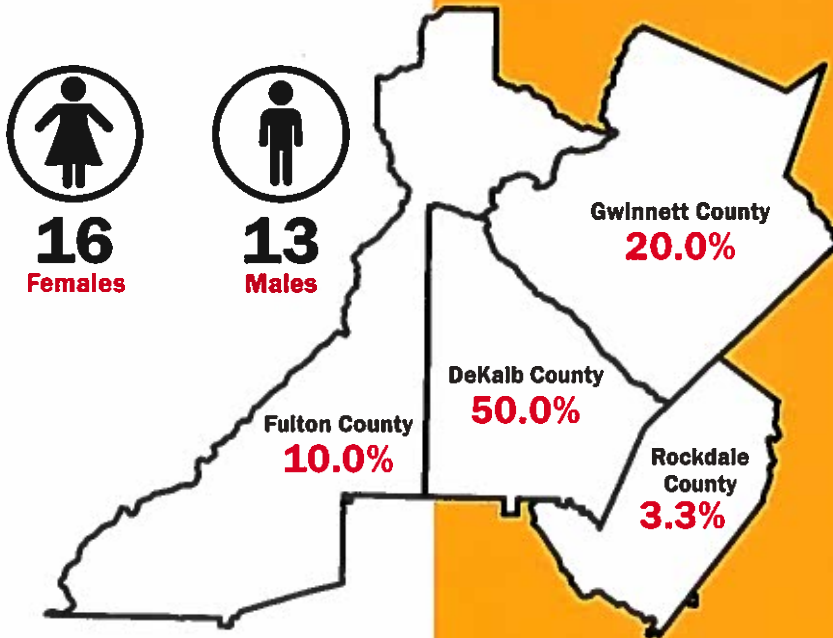
COHORT R, CLASS OF 2020 High School Class of 2024-29 Graduates
